

# animalius Tips to optimise your referrals

- Have all the relevant patient information readily accessible before starting your referral.
- Always send your anaesthetic record: it helps us plan.
- Use a structured approach to write your referral. For example:



## Medicine, Dentistry & Surgery

- Communicate your primary concern, all the comorbidities and state whether your concerns are different to the clients.
- Collate and curate documents: Label them!
- Don't start new medications (especially antibiotics), immediately before referral. If in doubt, seek advice.

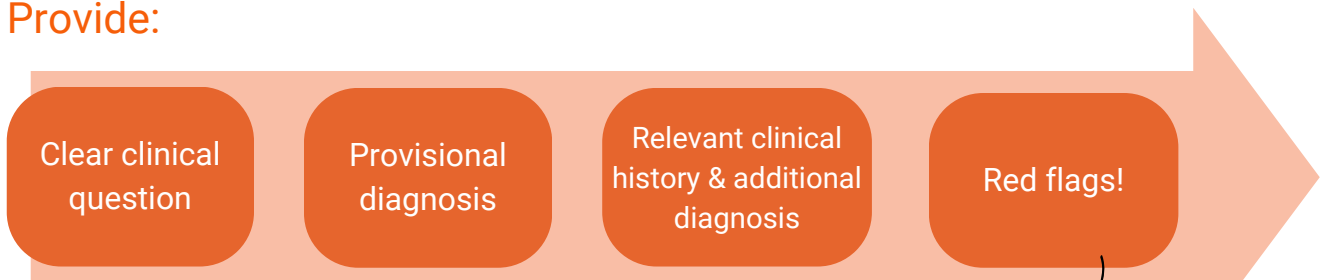
## Pain Clinic

- Provides a plan: assessment, pharmaceutical options, interventional procedures.
- Does not provide diagnosis or diagnostic interpretation. Please provide these.

## Radiology outpatient studies (US, CT, MRI)

- For these cases, you have primary control and are responsible for managing the results, next steps (including medications or treatments), and any referral to another service.

Provide:



Highlight red flags: are there any specific concerns or dangers that you are aware of? Is there anything else important we need to know? Medications, comorbidities, surgeries?
